Dear MMTA Members,

The 2nd Pat Simpson Winners' Concert will be a collaboration with the UM Stamps Quartet. Congratulations to all winners' students and teachers. Please note that the next edition for this event will be in November 2024. Moving forward, this competition will take place every two years.

The rule that requires members to attend 2 events to enter students in the Scholarships and Honors Recital Auditions has been updated. Starting in January 2023, MMTA teachers will be able to attend the 2 required events in an extended period from January to December of the year prior to entering students. It is the member's responsibility to sign up the attendance form when attending an event. The application form to enter students will require teachers to state the dates when they attended the 2 events. MMTA will not provide this information to teachers if they don't keep this record themselves. Chairperson will verify attendance to accept the application form. As an alternative to meet this requirement, MMTA teachers may enroll a minimum of 2 students in the Fall Recital and/or Spring Recital. Each Recital counts towards 1 attendance requirement.

It is with much sadness that we received the news that our long-time member Ms. Rieko Nakashima passed away on December 26th, 2022. She was always very supportive to MMTA sending donations and registering her students for our events. On behalf of MMTA, we sent flowers to her funeral in appreciation for all the years she dedicated to our association and to music education. Once we have more information and details on how we will use it, we will share it with you all.




MEMBERS NEWS:
