#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear MMTA Members,

As I write my last letter as MMTA President, my heart is full of joy for everything we have accomplished together during the past two years. Thank you for your trust and support. Thank you to the board members who shared this journey with me:

Paul Posnak, Vice-President of Programming, Carl Lauderman, Vice-President of Membership & Yearbook, Zelda Jensen, Director, Jay Harragin, Treasurer, Yianni Iliadis, Corresponding Secretary, and Sarah Salz, Recording Secretary.



#### Summary of approved changes during the term 2021-2023:

- Yearbook will be replaced for website updates and newsletters posted on the website
- Merit Scholarship fee raised from \$25 to \$35 starting on the next edition in 2024
- Honors Audition total of participants changed from 3 to 5 per teacher
- Student Day registration fee was raised from \$35 to \$40 per student (approved by FSMTA)
- Pat Simpson Concerto Competition will be held in the Fall every 2 years. Next edition will be in the Fall 2024
- CD's accounts were moved into Investment accounts on Fidelity
- Ms. Rieko Nakashima's donation will go towards a new scholarship on her name. Her beneficiary Stacey Lowe will be part of setting the requirements. MMTA board will be notified when funds are available. MMTA members will receive the requirements as soon as they are established.
- Board position "Corresponding Secretary" was eliminated. Current President will follow up with email correspondence
- Board position "Recording Secretary" will update the website: Calendar, Events information, and members list throughout the year. For major updates, the webmaster will be contacted.
- MMTA members' attendance rule was changed: MMTA teachers will be able to attend the 2 required events in an extended period from January to December of the year prior to entering students. As an alternative to meet this requirement, MMTA teachers may enroll a minimum of 2 students in the Fall Recital, Spring Recital, and/or Fundraising Gala. Each Recital counts towards 1 attendance requirement.

Thank you to each of you who shared this journey with me. It was an honor to serve as the MMTA President for the past two years. I will continue my contribution as the chairperson for the Honors and Scholarships Auditions and for the Student Day Program. You can count on me for any help needed as the new board continues our mission!

#### 2<sup>nd</sup> PAT SIMPSON CONCERTO COMPETITION WINNERS CONCERT

The three Winners of the MMTA Pat Simpson Concerto Competition performed with focus, poise and mature musicianship at the St. Thomas Episcopal Church on Sunday, April 30<sup>th</sup>. They were accompanied by the UM Frost School's superb Stamps String Quartet, playing reductions for string quartet of the orchestral concerto scores.

The program began with "Strum" a short, brilliant, edgy piece for string quartet written by young composer Jesse Montgomery. This was followed by our three Winners: 3<sup>rd</sup> Winner, Alexa Vidal, playing the Haydn Concerto in C, Mvt 1; The Accolay Concerto for Violin, Mvt. 1 with 2<sup>nd</sup> Prize Winner Alexander Litvinenko; and 1<sup>st</sup> Prize Winner Aleksandra Deshavaia playing the Mozart Concerto, K.412, mvt. 1. The second half of the program was a vivid performance by the Stamps Quartet of a Haydn Quartet, often called "The Joke".

The audience of Board members, parents, families, and friends was impressed, inspired and enthusiastic - a wonderful way to spend the late last Sunday afternoon of April.

#### In Memoriam:

Rieko Nakashima, long-time member of the Miami Music Teachers Association, passed peacefully on December 26, 2022, in Miami, surrounded by close friends and devoted piano students. She had just celebrated her 74<sup>th</sup> birthday eight days prior to her passing.

Rieko was born in Japan to Dr. Tadayoshi Nakashima and Mrs. Fukuko Kondo. Her father was a biochemist and researcher, and his work and fellowships led the family to reside in Europe, Hawaii, and eventually Miami, Florida where they settled in their Palmetto Bay home.



For nearly 25 years, Dr. Nakashima was a research professor of Molecular and Cellular Evolution at the University of Miami.

For multiple years, he was recognized as an accomplished scientist in the Marquis Who's Who In America. Rieko's mother, Fukuko, tutored privately Japanese and other subjects to primary students. Though they left Japan and did not return, the Nakashima family were amply proud of their heritage and culture. Rieko's meticulous teaching style reflected the deep influence of her parents and Japanese background.

Rieko earned her Bachelor of Music in Piano Performance from the North Carolina School of the Arts, and Master of Music in Piano Performance from the Juilliard School. After graduation, she became an adjunct professor and private piano instructor at Miami Dade College, Miami Christian College, and Trinity International University. From 1978-1995, she was the pianist and music director for services at the Unity Center for Christian Living.

Rieko was a member of the National Federation of Music Clubs and Miami Music Teachers Association for over thirty years. Her students consistently received superior or excellent ratings at the Junior Festival and won at competitive events. As a teacher, she will be remembered for her discipline, attention to detail, scholarship, and gentle but strict manner. Marilyn Gore, student, and friend of Rieko for 15 years, shared that "Ms. Nakashima was a gentle giant. Her calm personality and soft-spoken demeanor provided a great balance to her meticulous and firm demand for the lesson's perfection."

Rieko was reserved and private, though she appreciated anyone who could make her laugh. Keeping loyal to her Japanese heritage and traditions, Rieko demonstrated the utmost care and hospitality to her friends. Furthermore, her love and friendship extended to furry creatures. Rieko loved all animals and was known to feed the stray cats at Miami Dade College. She will be dearly missed by all her students and friends.
